- Campbell Stainless Steel Tank and Pump Station project is in progress

- Bisbee/Douglas Voluntary Soil Remediation Programs
 - Freeport Minerals Corporation plans to restart the Bisbee and Douglas Soil programs in late summer 2023, offering soil sampling and remediation in the Bisbee and Douglas areas specifically for property owners who did not previously participate in the programs
 - Sampling and remediation are voluntary and free of charge for developed residential, commercial and public properties
 - Property owners whose soil exceeds levels established by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality will have an opportunity to request that their soil be replaced, and their landscaping restored, free of charge
 - Freeport anticipates opening outreach offices in Bisbee and Douglas later this year to provide service to property owners who choose to participate in the voluntary soil programs.

- We have been conducting a rigorous risk assessment process at all of our tailings facilities and have changed some facility consequence classifications to align with the criteria of the standard. Details will be shared at the Q3 CPP meeting.
- The assessment and consequence classifications will be reflected in our disclosure documents which will be updated and posted on <u>Freeport-McMoRan I FCX</u> in August.

Community Engagement / Development Update

Tailings Management Update

The video shared at the meeting - <u>Tailings Update Video</u>. The video focused on tailings storage facilities, Tailings Management at Freeport, and the Global Industry Standard on tailings management.

- Copper Queen Branch Operations and Tailings Storage Facility
 - Deposition began in the North Concentrator Tailings Storage Area in the 1920s and in the South Concentrator Tailings Storage Area in the 1950s
 - Deposition ended in both Concentrator Tailings Storage areas in 1974. Site has been inactive since 1991
- Reclamation History
 - Reclamation completed between 2011 to 2014
 - o Regraded exterior slope angle of both CTSAs
 - Established rip rap lined surface water side slope channels on downstream face
 - Evapotranspiration cover design composed of locally borrowed soils revegetated with native plant species
 - Three main down drains constructed using ACB (articulated concrete blocks)

- Constructed geomembrane-lined (with two feet of cover on top) attenuation basins to manage stormwater on the tops of both CTSAs.
- o Design is meeting the goals of wildlife habitat and ecosystem re-establishment
- TSF Performance Objectives Regularly analyzed to confirm performance
 - o Stable under static (normal) conditions
 - o Stable under an extreme earthquake, a 10,000-year recurrence interval event
 - o Stable under an extreme storm rainfall, the Probable Maximum Precipitation (PMP)

Risk Assessment

- Risk assessments have confirmed the absence of credible failure modes that could present risk to people or the environment
- o Bisbee tailings have:
 - Lack saturated tailings with low strength
 - Have no risk of overtopping from excess surface water (PMF)
 - Have no risk of internal erosion from excess water pressures

Safe Closure

A closed tailings facility that does not pose ongoing material risks to people or the environment which has been confirmed by an Independent Technical Review Board (ITRB) or senior independent technical reviewer and signed off by the Accountable Executive (Global Industry Standard on Tailings Management (Tailings Standard, 2020).

ITRB Confirmed Safe Closure in June 2023-"The ITRB confirms Freeport's determination that the Bisbee facilities demonstrate safe closure status based on the absence of material risk to people and the environment as per the definition from the GISTM" (*Bisbee ITRB Technical Memorandum 06-23*).

ITRB determination also confirmed and agreed upon by FCX Accountable Executive – William Cobb (Vice President and Chief Sustainability Officer).

 - o Groundwater, erosion, and piezometer monitoring and reporting on going
 - Copper Queen Branch continues to monitor and maintain the site per the Tailings Management System

Jones Canyon Project | The Jones Canyon Stormwater improvement project has been completed.

Precipitation Plant Update Demolition of the old precipitation plant will begin in the first half of 2024.

The **Bisbee/Douglas Voluntary Soil Remediation Program** is open to those few property owners who did not participate in soil testing before the program concluded in 2016. This includes:

 ~ 800 properties scattered through Old Bisbee, Saginaw, Bakerville, Warren, Galena and Briggs and ~ 500 properties in Douglas between E Avenue to the east, W. Irvine Ave. in Pirtleville to the north and County Hospital Road to the west.

- Solicitation letters sent to eligible property owners and open house events were held in Bisbee and Douglas to explain and enlist participants.
- Sampling is expected to begin in the first half of 2024.Call the Soil Program at 520-432-5418 or 866-930-3244 to schedule an appointment.
