Sierrita Operatons Update

Site strategic update:

- Exceptional second quarter for Sierrita
 - Best safety quarter since 2017
 - No reportable environmental incidents and dust was well controlled
 - Exceeded operational targets
 - Awarded Copper Mark (mentioned last meeting)
- Parcel 30: continue work with Town of Sahuarita Parks & Recreation to finalize trail design concept
 Employee update:
 - Cara Forbregd, new Health and Safety Manager
 - Employee count: approximately 1,200
 - Average contractors: approximately 160
 - Open positions: 220

Stockpile Management:

Design Criteria:

- Permitted heights based on FAA
- Third-party geotechnical review
- Equipment capabilities
- Land availability

Operational Practices:

- Dump over or push dump
- Light plants for illumination
- Bulldozers for stockpile advancement
- Water trucks for dust control

Tailings Management:

- Tailings Personnel
 - Operations 49
 - Handle daily operations and report any unusual findings to engineers
 - Geotechnical Engineers 8

- Give guidance to operations on best practices. Responsible for monitoring stability equipment and completing weekly and monthly field inspections

Environmental Update:

Freeport-McMoRan Sierrita received two awards from the Wildlife Habitat Council in June 2022.

- Awareness and Community Engagement Project 2022 The Buffelgrass Education and Management project. Working with the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum, the company hosted "Beat Back Buffelgrass" events in which community volunteers removed the noxious invasive species from West Desert Trails.
- Desert Project 2022 Enhancing Bat Pollinator Habitat at West Desert Trails. Sierrita
 collaborated with conservation partners at Bat Conservation International and Borderlands
 Restoration Network to plant hundreds of native agaves in West Desert Trails. These agaves
 support nectar-feeding bat species that migrate between Central Mexico and the southwestern
 United States.

These are the first Wildlife Habitat Council awards Sierrita has received since the development of the Biodiversity Program in 2017.

Mitigation Hiearchy – required for any land disturbance project that reslults in a 'material' impact:

- to natural habitats
- to significant ('priority') biodiversity feature
- to priority ecosystem service
- to protected area

Community Engagement / Development Update

Freeport-McMoRan Formal Engagement Process

Freeport-McMoRan's primary formal stakeholder engagement is conducted through the Community Partnership Panel (CPP) meeting process. CPP meetings occur in Freeport-McMoRan communities and consist of stakeholders who represent a cross-section of the community.

The quarterly stakeholder meetings are designed to:

- Share information and encourage dialogue (questions, concerns, input) about the company's operational activities, including actual or perceived positive or negative impacts, so that we may respond or address
- Discuss social issues and related community development needs to support the preparation, navigation or actions needed to address risks to resilience, including eventual transition to a post mining scenario
- Share projects and foster collaboration that leads to successful communities and operating environments
