#### **Employment Update**

- Climax operations: Current employment is 361 with a target headcount of 409
- Henderson operations: Current employment is 342 with a target headcount of 380

#### **Environmental Update**

- McNulty Gulch Overburden Stockpile Facility Expansion
  - Clearing vegetation in 2017 continuing in 2018
  - Phase 1 compensatory wetland mitigation work (9 acres) at Lake Irwin site targeted for completion by end of 2018
  - McNulty water control construction work scheduled to begin in 2019

#### The Verizon tower is now live on Fremont Pass

- Climax and its contractor Alternative Energy Solutions worked with Verizon to install the cell tower on Climax property to improve cell service at the Climax operations which will also benefit highway and county communication services in the Climax mine vicinity, particularly on the north side of Fremont Pass into Copper Mountain
- The 4G service provided by the new tower was operational on February 5 and is in a startup phase
  - Current T-Mobile and AT&T service will not be affected

## **Community Engagement Update**

## Freeport-McMoRan Foundation Investments — Grant Opportunities/Social Investing

**The Freeport-McMoRan Foundation is proud to partner** with the Tabor Opera House Foundation on the Tabor Opera House temporary heater system installation. In 2017, the Tabor Opera House Foundation received \$50,000.

Project Overview:

- Community Priority and Focus Area: Community and Economic Development
- Project update: The heater installation project is still in process and awaiting air quality testing results
- Outcome(s) measured: Without the heater, the Opera House cannot host winter events
  - 16 events for 2017 summer season vs. 20 promised for a full year once we have heat vs. 5 the year before
  - 1,891 visitors for 2017 summer season plus several hundred private visitors post-season (with coats!)
- Other partners/investors: Lake County, City of Leadville funding for match; State of Colorado Dept. of Public Health and Environment Superfund/Brownfields unit leader for asbestos remediation grant
- Most positive impact to community: Project not complete yet, but we now know we have great demand for winter tours and events, including movies, community events and performances.
  - We will exceed by multiples of our first estimate the economic impact and community engagement we promised once heater is in
- Next steps: Asbestos remediation for heater rooms and then installation of the temporary heating system
  - The Foundation has identified remediation contractors and is working with a State agency to comply with remediation grant requirements in order to save all designated heater system funds for getting the most heat possible

<u>High-Grade Helpers</u> — Freeport-McMoRan has a commitment to creating a culture of corporate citizenship through its volunteer activities throughout the year, where employees are encouraged to apply their skills and serve, to help their local communities grow and thrive. **Across our Colorado operations, employees volunteered a total of 332 hours in 2017**.



#### **Community Discussion Summary**

#### Leadership Initiative for Sustainable Communities

During the first quarter, the Panel welcomed the Climax-Area Cohort to present an update related to their work around Access to Attainable Housing Initiative.

- Lake County has engaged Economic & Planning Systems to conduct a housing needs assessment for Leadville and the County, focusing on tools and strategies to address housing needs and challenges. This is a strategic effort, informed by a targeted analysis of the Lake County housing market and community context. The goal of this work is to produce a clear, concise roadmap for implementing actions, policies, and investments that will create new housing opportunities for all Lake County residents, particularly lower income households.
- The Housing Coalition began work on the Housing Needs Assessment as part of its effort to address affordable housing concerns. On February 7, there was a community meeting to help identify issues related to affordable housing in Lake County.
