Water Strategy Presentation

At the Fall 2024 CPP meeting, we asked CPP members to share questions they had about Freeport's water strategy. Using those questions as a basis, Cassandra Leonard, Water Resource Specialist, joined our Spring CPP to share the company's water strategy, including key information on water supply, water stewardship and water policy. After the presentation, CPP members were asked what they felt was the most important aspect of our water strategy. Water recycling and sustainability were the most common responses.

Freeport's water strategy focuses on optimizing water use efficiency, minimizing the use of new freshwater and increasing the use of renewable and recycled water. The company achieved a water use efficiency rate of 89% for 2023. *Fit for Use* is a company initiative to identify the minimum water quality needs for processes to help transition to more renewable water sources. The effort considers climate change and aging infrastructure impacts.

Fort Madison Water Management

• Fort Madison engages in ongoing monitoring of water use, discharge and recycling/reuse. Over 2.5 million gallons of water were recycled in 2024.



Operations Update

- 350 days without a recordable safety incident and zero recordable incidents in 2025.
- Significant improvements have been achieved in Fatal Risk Management leadership participation.
- Climax Molybdenum received a safety facility award from the American Chemistry Council. This award is given to facilities with significant achievements in Health & Safety Performance.
- The Molybdenum Sulfide expansion has been completed, and the DC-3 calciner expansion is currently being commissioned to further increase product capacity and to improve health and safety and environmental performance.
- The capital request for the silo replacement has been submitted and is pending approval.
- Annual plant shutdown for general maintenance and upkeep is scheduled to start on May 12 and last approximately 50 days. There will be increased activity and contractor presence on site during the shutdown.

Environmental Update

- Installation of a new continuous emissions monitoring system (CEMS) to improve environmental monitoring of the acid plant.
- Engineering and permitting phases have begun for the design and construction of a new sanitary wastewater treatment plant, which is expected to be completed by 2027.
