## INVESTMENT

**\$190,168** DOLLARS INVESTED

One recipient of Freeport-McMoRan Foundation funds, City of Fort Madison, received \$25,000 to develop a conceptual design of a riverfront destination that will provide recreation and family opportunities along with increasing the number of visitors to the area. This is the next phase of the Fort Madison marina rehabilitation project.

Through a partnership between Climax Molybdenum Company and Lee County Conservation, over 100 seventh grade students from Central Lee and Holy Trinity Schools participated in a hands-on learning day focused on freshwater mussels and the ecosystem.

Stations set up at Heron Bend Conservation Area provided the students an opportunity to canoe on the Mississippi River and discuss mussel habitats, collect mussels to identify the difference species, participate in pond netting to observe and identify organisms and learn about water quality and testing.

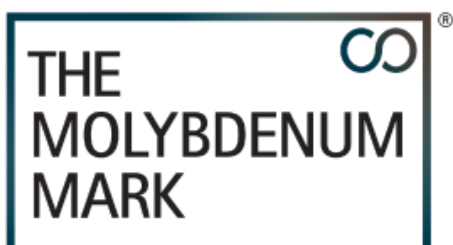

Freeport-McMoRan has achieved the Copper Mark at all 12 of its copper producing sites globally and has achieved the Molybdenum Mark at its two primary molybdenum mines, four copper mines that produce by-product molybdenum and at its molybdenum conversion facilities.
