Miami Operations

- Smelter November Turnaround
 - Turnaround Schedule: November 1 December 8 (38 days for project tie-ins)
 - Turnaround required for Environmental Compliance Project tie-ins prior to January 1, 2018
 - Major Smelter Scope:
 - Routine Shutdown projects Acid plant catalyst screening, oxygen plant maintenance, ISA boiler casing/expansion joint repair, duct cleaning throughout the smelter, 75-ton crane maintenance, radial flow scrubber maintenance and duct replacement, heat exchanger cleaning and maintenance
 - · Install larger intermediate acid coolers
 - Smelter Compliance Project Tie-ins
 - · Tie-in aisle scrubber
 - · Tie-in new caustic delivery system
 - · Remove existing/install new tail gas stack
