Tyrone Operations recently received approval for a modification to the air emissions permit to reflect current mining needs. Tyrone's updated Closure Closeout plan has been submitted to the state and is currently undergoing review.

Chino Operations completed the White Water Creek historic mining remediation project. Chino is currently working on sitewide internal operational improvements with consultant McKinsey to maximize the full potential of the operations.
