# **COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP PANEL**

Meeting Notes Summary

Morenci August 9, 2022

# **Purpose**

The <u>Community Partnership Panel</u> is hosted by Freeport-McMoRan to keep the community informed about operational activities and to foster open and ongoing dialogue to develop thoughtful solutions and address community issues.

Morenci shared the following information:

- Third quarter employment update: Current employment: approximately 3,860 full time employees; Vacancies approximately 180; Contractors: current average of 1,600
- Current community projects:
  - o US 191 / Mountain Avenue intersection relocation
  - o Addition of four fueling stations and 2 electric vehicle charging stations at the Marathon
  - Infrastructure for electric vehicles charging stations, two each at bowling alley, community center, motel
  - Remodeling of American Legion building
  - Water tank at Shannon Hill
  - Paving in Morenci church parking lots, road to cemetery, fire station, GO building, general resurfacing of streets
  - New skate park by County Fields Complex
  - Work to repair damage caused by July 24 rainstorm in progress
  - o Stabilization of highwall on Highway 191, area across the Train Depot
- Future community projects:
  - o Producer stockpile projected to commence in 2024
  - o Remodeling of Gila Health Resources building starts August 25
  - Utilities upgrades in Park Avenue, Clifton starts Q4
  - Utilities upgrades in Morenci (Copper Road and lateral streets)
- Community opportunities
  - Available space for lease at Morenci shopping center coming soon
  - o Opportunity to open a feed store in Morenci, by the corrals
  - Letter sent to Morenci employees related to rental of personal RV's

The Environmental Department provided an update on last quarter's reportable incidents and current permitting efforts (Producer stockpile, Upper Eagle Creek fish barrier, and Yellow Bill Cuckoo). It was also shared that Morenci operations received couple of biodiversity awards in the previous quarter: two awards from the

Wildlife Habitat Council in the categories of Mammals Project () and Caves and Subterranean Habitats Project (Bat conservation); conservation award from the Arizonan Game & Fish department for the site's contribution towards managing Rocky Mountain Big Horn Sheep; and ADEQ's Voluntary Environmental Stewardship Program issued the Platinum Level recertification to Morenci operations.

An update about the ongoing Clifton Soil Program was provided, sharing that all property owners have received letters of solicitation to participate in the program, and that 609 have chosen to participate, Also shared that ADEQ approved the Response Action Work Plan submitted, and that soil cleanup pis expected to start in October 2022. A description of the cleanup work plan was shared with the CPP.

# **Community Engagement / Development Update**

Morenci Community Development shared the results of previous CPP meetings Menti questions results, as well as all the combined responses from all of Norht America Freeport sites. In Greenlee County the <u>Most Important</u> aspect of Freeport's Social Performance selected was Stakeholder Engagement and Grievance Management; the Most important aspect to <u>Improve</u> of Freeport's Social Performance was Social Baseline Data and Impact Assessment; and the Aspect of Freeport's Social Performance <u>Performed Best</u> was Social Investment.

### Freeport-McMoRan Formal Engagement Process

Freeport-McMoRan's primary formal stakeholder engagement is conducted through the Community Partnership Panel (CPP) meeting process. CPP meetings occur in Freeport-McMoRan communities and consist of stakeholders who represent a cross-section of the community.

The quarterly stakeholder meetings are designed to:

- Share information and encourage dialogue (questions, concerns, input) about the company's operational activities, including actual or perceived positive or negative impacts, so that we may respond or address
- Discuss social issues and related community development needs to support the preparation, navigation or actions needed to address risks to resilience, including eventual transition to a post mining scenario
- Share projects and foster collaboration that leads to successful communities and operating environments
