### **Morenci Operations Update**

- Training Center located in Clifton will be fully operational by March 9. Planning for an open house the afternoon of May 1, 2020.
- Mine overlook construction has started with estimated opening of May 2020.
- American Mountain mining will be picking up with a second shovel.
- Silver Basin Phase III construction will start the second quarter of 2020.
- Tailings Storage Facility Phase III of the tailings distribution system will start construction the second quarter of 2020.
- New bowling lanes installed with the addition of Hyper Bowling.

### Environmental

- No reportable events since November 4, 2019
- Aquifer Protection Permit (APP) – work to permit Producer stockpile has commenced. App application will be submitted around June 2020 with an estimated permit completion target date in 2021.

### Clifton Soil Program (VRP)

- Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) encourages interested parties to investigate and, if necessary, clean up potentially impacted sites.
- Voluntary Remediation Program (VRP) enables interested parties to work cooperatively with ADEQ to remediate sites.
- Under the Clifton Soil Program, with the permission and voluntary participation of individual property owners, Freeport will sample soils at developed residential, commercial and public properties within Clifton.

- Freeport then will offer to remediate properties with soils that exceed ADEQ-approved, site-specific cleanup levels for arsenic, lead, or copper – at no charge to property owners.

#### Voluntary Remediation Program

- Preparation is underway of the Clifton Soil Program Outreach Office located at 430 N. Coronado Blvd. (Telephone: 1-800-672-0690)
- Coordinating with ADEQ’s Public Notice process for the Human Health Risk Assessment.
- Residential Solicitation Letters are being prepared.
