Freeport McMoRan Climate Change Strategies

Freeport-McMoRan's climate strategy pillars include reduction, resilience and contribution. Our goal is to reduce greenhouse gas emission intensity in the Americas by 15% per metric ton of copper cathode by 2030 from our 2018 baseline. We aspire to participate and positively contribute to a 2050 net zero economy.

At Freeport, we are working to enhance our resilience to both physical and transitional risks associated with climate change for our operations, our host communities, and our stakeholders. This includes working to analyze and prepare for extreme weather events, water stress and other climate change impacts. Following completion of a recently completed physical climate risk analysis, we identified four main themes that we aim to integrate into our climate resiliency strategy going forward. These include: wet extremes, heat extremes, emerging water stress, and sea level rise. At present, we plan to focus our attention on those regions and risk factors that have emerged as highest priority from this initial screening assessment of physical climate risks. These include coastal flooding analysis and precipitation analysis at all operating sites to help inform our designs, decision making and collaboration with stakeholders. We will also continue working closely with host communities to help support and enhance their resilience to potential physical risks related to climate change. Visit Freeport-McMoRan Inc. The Environmental Department provided an update on last quarter's reportable incidents and current permitting efforts (Producer stockpile, Upper Eagle Creek fish barrier, and Yellow Bill Cuckoo). It was also shared that Morenci operations received couple of biodiversity awards in the previous quarter: two awards from

the Wildlife Habitat Council in the categories of Mammals Project (Rocky Mountain Bighorn Sheep) and Caves and Subterranean Habitats Project (Bat conservation); conservation award from the Arizonan Game & Fish department for the site's contribution towards managing Rocky Mountain Big Horn Sheep; and ADEQ's Voluntary Environmental Stewardship Program issued the Platinum Level recertification to Morenci operations.

An update about the ongoing Clifton Soil Program was provided, sharing that all property owners have received letters of solicitation to participate in the program, and that 609 have chosen to participate, Also shared that ADEQ approved the Response Action Work Plan submitted, and that soil cleanup pis expected to start in October 2022. A description of the cleanup work plan was shared with the CPP.

Community Engagement / Development Update

Morenci Community Development shared the results of previous CPP meetings Menti questions results, as well as all the combined responses from all of North America Freeport sites. In Greenlee County the **Most Important_**aspect of Freeport's Social Performance selected was Stakeholder Engagement and Grievance Management; the Most important aspect to **Improve** of Freeport's Social Performance was Social Baseline Data and Impact Assessment; and the Aspect of Freeport's Social Performance **Performed Best** was Social Investment.

Freeport-McMoRan's primary formal stakeholder engagement is conducted through the Community Partnership Panel (CPP) meeting process. CPP meetings occur in Freeport-McMoRan communities and consist of stakeholders who represent a cross-section of the community.

The Environmental Department provided an update on last quarter's reportable incidents and current permitting efforts (Producer stockpile, Upper Eagle Creek fish barrier, and Yellow Bill Cuckoo).

An update about the Clifton Soil Program was provided, sharing that all property owners have received letters of solicitation to participate in the program, and that 62% have chosen to participate, as well that 111 out of 921 parcels are eligible for soil cleanup. A contracting issue delayed the work but the issue has been resolved. Preparatory work is expected to begin in December 2022, soil cleanup in January 2023; and a target completion date of December 2023.

Morenci also shared the ongoing work toward enhancing Morenci's Crisis Management Plan, which is starting with tailings emergencies. A presentation about Morenci's Tailings Storage Facilities will be shared at the Q1-23 CPP meeting, during which an opportunity to provide input on the emergency response plan co-developed with local Emergency Management agencies will be discussed.
