## Current Community Projects:

- Remodeling of Gila Health Resources building Still working on Occupational Medicine and Pharmacy
- o American Legion restrooms remodel and back access areas were completed Q2 2024
- Copper Road and parallel streets water and power lines upgrade Contractor change delayed work, and the projected completion date was pushed to October 2024
- Park Avenue water utilities and power lines upgrade Contractor change delayed work,
   and the projected completion date was pushed to October 2024
- o New waterline route on Hill Street to Sheriff's Department in Clifton is planned for Q4-2024
- New water line on Riverside Road in Clifton completed
- New infield dirt installation is underway at the Wildkitten Field Anticipated completion end of Q3 of 2024

#### **Environmental Update**

- Air Quality
  - Received Title V Permit Draft: posted the signage for the public
  - o Received comment from Center for Biological Diversity
  - o ADEQ Air Quality Division visited June 18-19
    - No Notice of Violation received
  - Completed retesting of three dust collectors that failed testing in April 2024
  - o Notice Of Violation closed by ADEQ in early July
  - o Amended open burn permit to add additional area for townsite burning of material

## Water Quality Aquifer Protection Permit Amendments in Progress

- Tailings re-slope 3.5 to 1, Columbine Reservoir Recommissioning, Silver Basin MFL, and other updates
- o Public Comment Period for this permit amendment is open
- ADEQ sent a formal request for additional information on March 12, 2024
  - Response was submitted May 17 and ADEQ requested additional information again
  - Morenci is working on the next response
- o APP Cleanup
  - Working with consultant to add ambient monitoring wells, new tailings seepage ponds, and other miscellaneous updates for October 2024 submittal

## Projects

- Lower Chase Creek Mitigation Site Relocation
  - Working with consultant to propose replacement mitigation area near San Francisco River Annex Site (SFRAS) to Army Corps of Engineers
  - Anticipate 6 to 8 months for completion
  - Yellow-Billed Cuckoo Management Plan Categorical exclusion is under review.
     Met with ranchers on July 12 to discuss path forward
- o Tribal Engagement
  - Hopi Tribe visited site May 1-2
  - Mescalero and White Mountain Apache tribes visited the site May 21-22
  - Ethnographic study is underway and anticipating a draft report 3Q of 2024
