Miami Rod Mill Celebrates its 50th Anniversary! During the past 50 years, the Miami Rod Mill has taken pride in its role in safely producing copper — melting pure copper cathode sheets and casting coils of copper rod used by wire-makers and other customers around the globe.

Community Development Update

Freeport-McMoRan has been named to the 2019 Just 100: [America's Best Corporate Citizens by Forbes](#). Freeport-McMoRan is the industry leader in the *Basic Resources* sector, and is first overall in the *Community Treatment* category. This is the third consecutive year Freeport-McMoRan has made the list, which is now in its third year.

The company receives the top Arizona honor for volunteer service: Freeport-McMoRan received the State of Arizona's highest honor for volunteerism as a recipient of the 2018 Governor's Volunteer Service Award in the Stewardship category.

Freeport-McMoRan partners with the **United Way** for an employee campaign to raise funds for the United Way chapters located in our operating communities.

Employees pledged more than \$3.55 million during the 2018 campaign; and more than **\$9.8 million** including the company match.

Miami Operations is proud to partner with the United Fund of Globe-Miami supporting more than 30 organizations in the local area.

Education Grant Opportunities: Mini-Grants for Education are designed to support K-12 teachers and schools in Freeport-McMoRan communities. **More than \$50,000** was invested through the Mini-Grants process in 2018.

In Globe-Miami, 14 grants were awarded:

- Globe Unified School District – seven grants, \$3,500
- Miami Unified School District – six grants, \$3,000
- San Carlos Secondary School – one grant, \$500

During the first quarter, the Panel welcomed the Globe-Miami Education Cohort to present an update related to their work around increasing the number of people engaged in efforts to promote education. The cohort presented information on a new multi-district and school program, Project ACE (All Children Eat), an in-school food and clothing bank program for underserved students. With the help of community partners, including the United Fund, local churches, and Freeport-McMoRan Miami operations, the program will start with a food and clothing drive. Subsequently, volunteers will organize collected items and assist in preparing school storage spaces. Volunteers will also pack weekend backpacks with non-perishable food and toiletry items for students in need, who rely on school meals for sustenance.

The education cohort, started by Freeport-McMoRan, identified social issues such as hunger as one of the key issues affecting student performance.
