Miami operations has responded to two community grievances in the last quarter. Topics of concern included:

- Poppies being cut along the Freeport-McMoRan fenceline in Claypool with weed debris and trash left behind
- Patullo Quarry activity schedule

Freeport-McMoRan has published a <u>Working Toward Sustainable Development (WTSD)</u> report annually since 2001. This 2018 WTSD report is meant to provide stakeholders with summary information on our sustainability programs, including policies, management systems and performance data. Community engagement and development is part of our company's culture and, since 2007, we have invested more than \$2 billion in social programs and projects. Currently, we are prioritizing our community investments on the development of skills for our workforce and community members. We want to empower people and communities with the skills and opportunities to construct meaningful futures.

Miami Operations: **Economic Impact Report**

The company commissioned the L. William Seidman Research Institute at Arizona State University to develop annual economic impact reports. Freeport-McMoRan's Miami operations generated an estimated \$74.8 million in economic benefits for Gila County and approximately \$220.7 million for Arizona in 2018. Miami operations employs almost 900 people and the ripple effect of wages and taxes plus services we purchase creates another 1,400 jobs in the state.

The Freeport-McMoRan Foundation is proud to partner with the Gila County Historical Society on the renovation and upgrade of the museum building. In 2018, the Gila County Historical Museum received \$40,000.

The Gila County Historical Museum is housed in a 100-year-old building, historically significant as the former Old Dominion Mine Rescue Station. The community priority and focus area for this project is Community and Economic Development: Increased Revenue Growth Through Tourism. The grant was used to renovate the garage and kitchen areas and the improvements have enhanced the attractiveness and usability of the building. Contractors, Ram Specialists and Kino Floors provided in-kind support and the project is now complete. The Museum has expanded its exhibits and hosted the second annual Old Dominion Days event September 11-14.
