

Working collaboratively, the Social Performance, Human Resources and Heath & Safety teams at Safford Mine partnered with Graham County Substance Abuse Coalition to offer substance abuse training to supervisors in 2023.

The forums were developed to help equip and empower front-line supervisors with skills to identify and address potential substance abuse at the mine site. The trainings addressed multiple topics, with a focus on Fentanyl as the most recent and dangerous substance trend and provided safety considerations when encountering someone who might under the influence or overdosing.

The sessions provided a foundation of education site employees can use when addressing this critical health issue while also addressing a concern raised in the recent Human Rights Impact Assessment done in Graham County.
