Man in The Maze Park, an 80-acre property in Sahuarita, was reclaimed, transformed and officially donated to the Town of Sahuarita in 2023 thanks to collaborative efforts by community stakeholders and conservation groups.

Key reclamation and education features include planting native Sonoran Desert species, creating over eight acres of pollinator habitat, informational kiosks about the natural and cultural heritage of the area, and designated areas with Tohono O’odham traditional food plants and wa:atos (mesquite ramadas).

FCX has achieved the Copper Mark at all 12 of its copper producing sites globally and has achieved the Molybdenum Mark at its two primary molybdenum mines, four copper mines that produce by-product molybdenum and at its molybdenum conversion facilities.
