
At Freeport, we are "Proudly Creating Better Futures," which means we work with communities to make transformative change and increase opportunity, well-being and capacity. We are pleased to highlight some of our key work from 2024 and look forward to a productive 2025 with you.

ENGAGEMENT

At Freeport's Sierrita operations, the collapse of a cherished crested saguaro cactus in the West Desert Trails Park presented an opportunity to demonstrate the power of community engagement, cultural collaboration and environmental stewardship. The unique cactus, felled by heavy rains and a bee colony, was a beloved landmark for trail users, and also part of multiple research projects, one recently in cancer studies at Arizona State University.

In response to its sudden collapse, Sierrita formed a multi-tiered partnership involving the local community, the Tohono O'odham Nation and a local beekeeper. Working with these groups, Freeport safely relocated the bees (protecting the public and pollinators) and helped ensure the fallen cactus was treated with cultural respect, including a saguaro harvest.

This partnership not only addressed the immediate challenges, but also highlights the value of collaborative problem-solving, cultural respect and environmental conservation.

AN IMPACT PROGRESS REPORT: THE SAHUARITA FOOD BANK AND COMMUNITY RESOURCE CENTER (SFB-CRC)



Two Community Investment Fund grants are supporting the development and implementation of the Saguaro Skills Center and its welding and IT support programs. The Center has graduated its first three students, with two new cohorts of five each undertaking the 400 clock-hour class. Specifically, the grants from Freeport include:

- Workforce Development Through Welding, \$114,000 (2023): Supporting the purchase of two augmented virtual reality welding training simulators, training of the instructor, and instructor compensation.
- Workforce Development Scholarships for Welding and IT Support, \$55,000 (2024): Providing 18 scholarships for welding and Google IT Support classes, with successful students receiving a national certification.
